GAMEY CASE Now Being Discussed in Ontario Legislature. REVIEW REPORT SUBMITTED BY INVESTIGATING COMMISSIONERS. Premier Says Gamey Is Discredited—Anxious to Get Back to Legitimate Business—Whitney Dissatisfied With Commission's Finding.

There were seventy in 1898, but only forty last year. The action quieted down in ill-temper and disappointment following the defeat, sometimes practitioners encouraged cases for the best, but more often the parties put them up as a defence in the general "strife of" depending on the chance of stumbling upon some stray evidence if forced to a declaration. Commissioners were not judges in the proper sense of the ordinary citizen and can be criticised for their action. Ron, George Brown, criticised judges of the supreme court and proceedings were taken against him for contempt of court. This was indecorous and they are to blame for the present condition of things.
