HAS AN EYE ON DOMAIN. Will Demand Concessions; Army Still Holds Situation.

Telgrade, June 20.—Fearing the effects of the Austro-Russian demoralization of the assassination of King Alexander, Queen Draga and others, the conspirators have taken an oath not to divulge one another's names or any particulars of the tragedy.

Cuts Diplomatic Relations. London, June 20.—In the House of Lords, Foreign Minister Lansdowne announced that the British minister at Servia had been instructed to withdraw from Belgrade for some time, on the arrival there of King Peter, and in the meanwhile to do nothing which could be construed as a recognition of the new government.

NEW REGULATIONS. Proposed By The Minister Of Education.

Toronto, June 20.—The committee of the Ontario Educational Association which is meeting here to consider the new regulations of the educational department, suggested by the minister, to-day, endorsed the proposal to take Latin from the compulsory list and to give options in French or other language in its place.

MAY MURDER CZAR. In Same Way As The King Of Serbia.

Berlin, June 20.—The leading Review Die Nation, to-day, states that the czar is in danger of sharing the fate of King Alexander, of Serbia, and of Disanaster Czar Paul, who went insane in 1800, and who was murdered in his palace March 29th, 1801.
