A Sydenham Resident Replies To The Criticisms Of His Letters For Sunday Observance

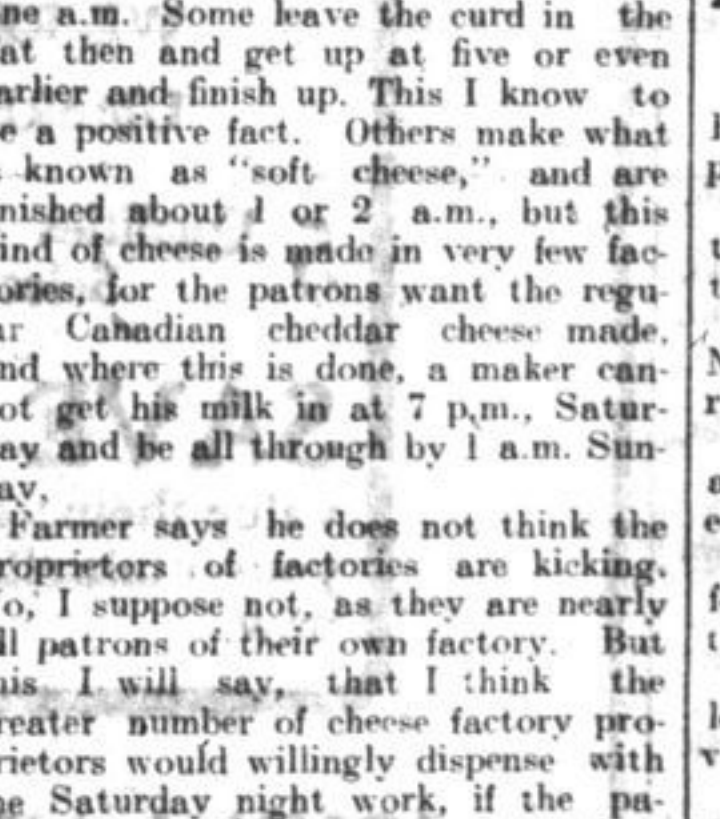
Sydenham, June 22.—(To the Editor: By your issues of the 11th and 18th inst. I see replies to my letter of the 3rd ult. I will endeavour to answer both my worthy friends in turn. It was not my intention in writing my first letter to carry on any discussion on the "care of milk" but I can not, however, let some very misleading assertions go unanswerd. I first take up the letter of my farmer friend Mr. H. H. Woodman, who writes me that he is a worthy farmer, like a good many of his disposition in all walks of life. He imagines he knows more on the subject of milk than those gentlemen who lecture at the Farmers' Institutes and who have made a thorough and practical study of the same. On this subject of care of milk I fear it is useless to enlighten him, as from the tone of his correspondence I think there is a big "dollar sign" before his mental vision. If, as Mr. Farmer says, he cares for the milk of from twenty to thirty cows, it is indeed a heavy task that he cannot keep his milk home of a Saturday night, even if he had to feed it to his hog. I know of several farmers, whose milk checks do not come between one and two hundred dollars a month, as my friend's, who can afford to keep, and do keep, their Saturday night's milk good, sweet and wholesome till Monday morning. Again if Mr. Farmer were to take a trip around his neighborhood he would find many who care for the milk of between forty and fifty cows rather than be the cause of any man breaking the Sabbath; and my maxim still holds good, for if my worthy farmer had the will he could easily find the way. But Farmer reminds me very strongly of the Pharisee in the temple; he thinks the Almighty he is "not a sinner like the publicans who work on Sunday," but when the monthly check comes along he does not stop to ask if a portion of the same has not been made for him on the Lord's day. No, he hastens away to get the bank, lest some one would get hold of it.

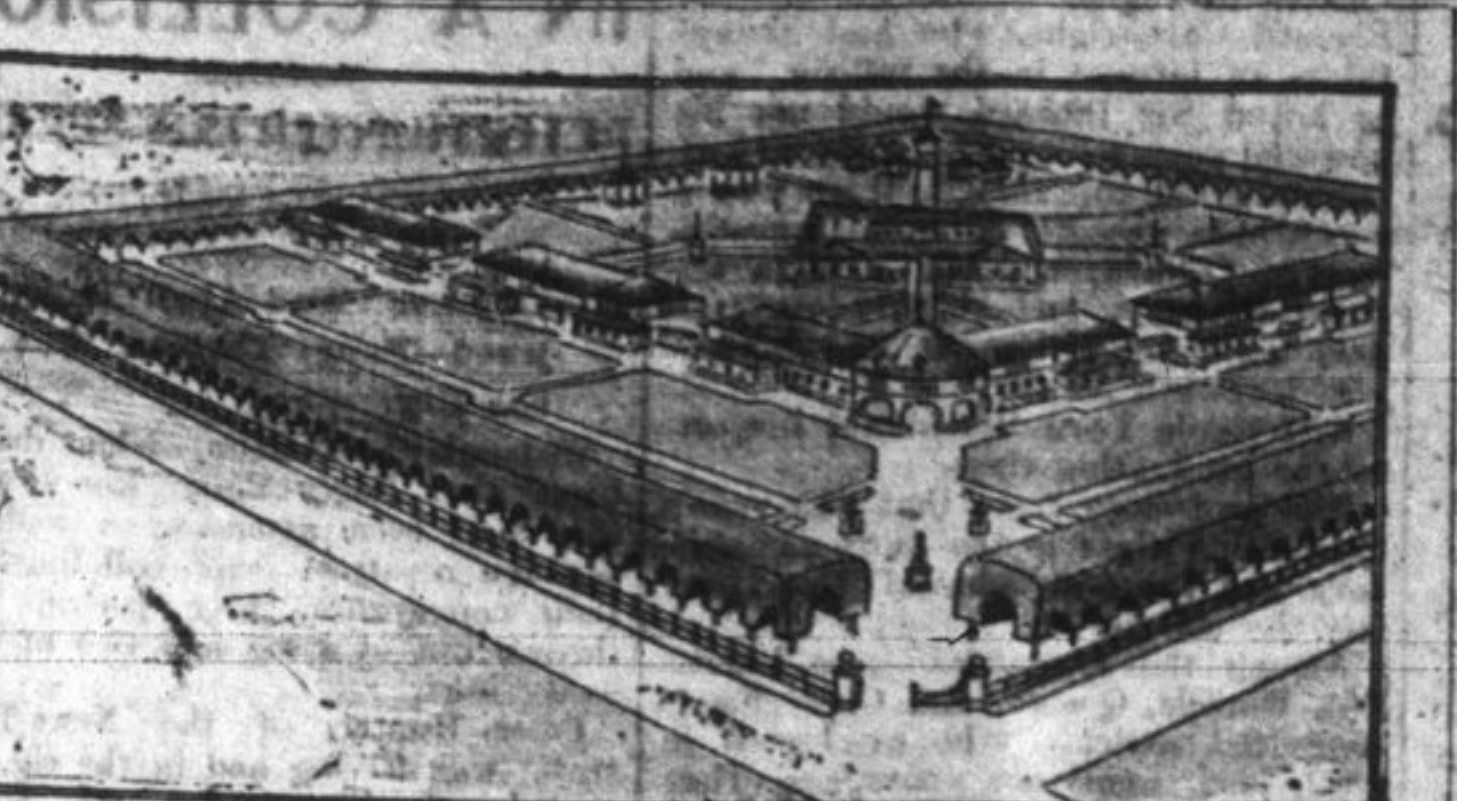
