Rome, July 14.—Pope Leo is credited with having said "If I am destined to die from this illness I feel I shall expire on Thursday, the feast day of the Carmelite Madonna, whom I specially worship."

The Carmelite Madonna is the patroness of the Carmelite order, which attributes its origin to the Prophet Elijah, who ascended to heaven in a chariot of fire.

FUNERAL SERVICE. The Burial of Late William John Livingston.

The funeral of the late W. J. Livingston occurred this morning. Rev. A. Laird, pastor of deceased, conducted service for the family at 9:30 o'clock, and spoke comfortingly to the bereaved.

The remains reposed in a black cloth covered casket and were carried to the grave by immediate relatives. The floral tributes were unusually numerous and beautiful.

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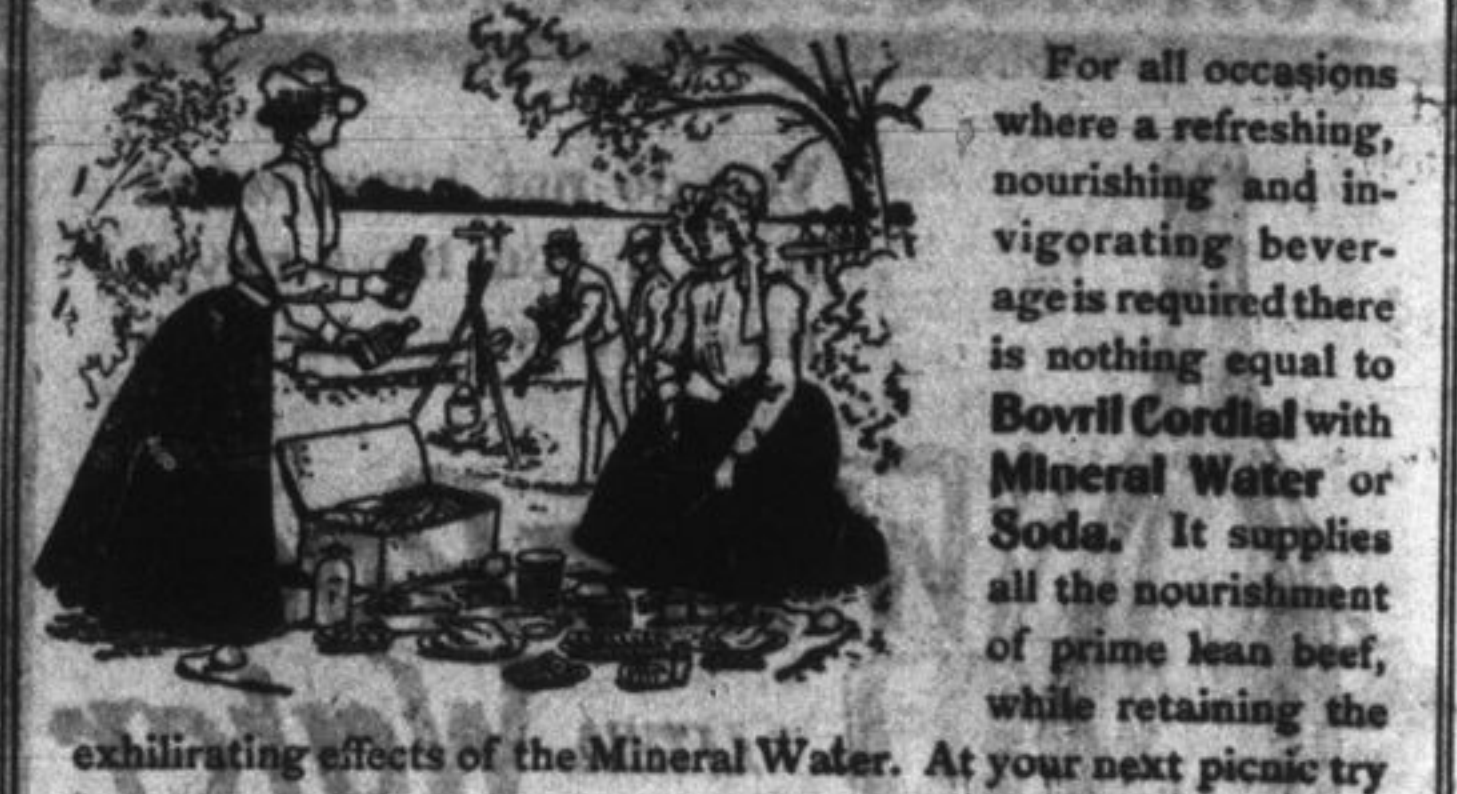
