Leo's Body in Throne Room - Mitre Will Replace the Hood To-day, and on Friday the Pall will Pay a Last Farewell.

Rome, July 22.—The body of Pope Leo XIII lies in the hall of the throne room, a few steps from the room in which his death took place. The same vestments, the "comano" hood, the rochet and the white gowns which were put on Monday over the form which rests in semi-state, surrounded by lighted candles, the noble guard and Franciscan penitentiaries.

Rampolla Asked to Stay. Rome, July 22.—There was a touching scene at the Vatican yesterday, when the nephews of Leo, with their families, entered the death chamber to take a last farewell of their uncle, for whom they had an intense reverence.

The news of the union of the scattered clans of Israel under King Saul, and their victory in Gibeon, soon reached their long-time oppressors, the Philistines.

Saul recruits the faithful at Gibeon, where Samuel had instructed him to wait before striking the first blow for independence.

Some years after the first campaign with the Philistines, the events of to-day's lesson occurred. Samuel, still the adviser of the king, brought word to Saul that Israel's ancient foe, the Amalekites, must be destroyed.
