COLLEGE LIFE IN CANADA DESCRIBED BY PROF. MACNAUGHTON.

Comments by the London Canadian Gazette—A Reference to Hong Lee, the Chinaman, Who Has Money to Queen's.

Canada, in proportion to her population, is well equipped with universities or colleges which have powers to grant degrees, numbering as they do seventeen. Of these, the five most important are: the Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario; the University of Toronto; the University of Ottawa; the University of Montreal; and the University of Western Ontario.
