



Faith In Them. There are so-called doctors, who sue so called "medical" pamphlets books under various titles; some pur porting to treat of love and matri mony, others to warn the reader Fagainst certain vices, but all serving to advertise the professional "s'kill" of the "doctors" publishing them, These books are called by various names— "Marriage Guide," "Matrimony Made Easy," "Experiences of an Invalid," and the like, Sometimes medical pamphlets are offered free, or for a few stamps for postage; in other cases they are advertised at prices

from ten cents to \$1. In order to induce the ignorant and vulgar to purchase, the advertisers often seek to give the impression that these books are indelicately illustrated. The books are always trashy and worse than worthless, for many creduloas persons in perfect health are led to believe themselves in need of treatment, and so waste money upon the advertisers in consultation fees or for medicine. In most cases these books are compiled from standard medical works, with alterations to suit the doctor's purpose; in other cases a mass of rubbish is furnished without

even a shadow of truth. The details of cures effected by these doctors are generally taken from the records of standard medical writers, with such change of names, etc., as may be deemed necessary. It is no uncommon thing to find in several of these quack books, issued by different men, the same cures described to the different men. Certificates in these books are usually bogus-nothing being easier than to manufacture themas the names and addresses are omitted "from motives of delicacy," so, of course, there are no means to test the truth of the statements, which in nine cases out of ten would not bear in vestigation. Many of the men who surport to be the author of these books haven't intelligence enough to write even such trash, or to compile

The work is usually done by hard-up liter-Sometimes these books purport be issued by associations or medical institutions. To expose every quack by name would be impossible, as every city swarms with them. It is a safe rule to place no confidence in any medical work given gratuitously, or for a triffing price, or which extols author's skill or gives certificates cases as evidence of such skill. No reputable physician publishes certificates of his success any more than a lawyer or clergyman would, and no physician of standing makes public any case treated by him, except in strictly professional books or periodi-cals, intended for professional use. The amount of quack medicine literature distributed throughout the country is immense. In writing these circulars the ingenuity displayed in work-

ing upon the feelings of the reader and gradually leading him to the point where, if he (or she) be weakminded, he may decide to take the stuff or die, is truly wonderful. Not less ingenious are the various inventions to account for the discovery of the medicine. In one case it is Old Mother Noble, who confers a boon upon the world; beloved Father Apply accidentally chews the leaves of bush and discovers his stuff; Israel Goodspeed goes to England, becomes a Gypsy, and one day while upon the beach finds a bottle drifting ashore which he picked up, etc., etc. Anything and everything to gull poor weak-minded human nature into ing and swallowing Indian. 
