TO RESTRICT IT TAKE ACTION AGAINST DUCK SHOOTING.

Resolution Asking For Patrol Boat To Visit Reservations Not Protected By Game Constables.

The Anglers' Association of the St. Lawrence River, which met at St. Lawrence Park, on Wednesday for its twentieth annual session...

The meeting was called at 11 o'clock by Vice-President Charles R. Skinner, Albany, in the place of President W. C. Browning, Brooklyn, who was absent.

After an address by Mr. Skinner, the secretary of the association, W. H. Thompson, Alexandria Bay, gave his report, which showed a membership of 100 over last year, and a balance of \$147.61 in the treasury.

The discussion of game laws and illegal hunting and shooting occupied a large share of the attention of the meeting. A motion was unanimously carried that efforts should be made to restrict duck shooting to four days in the week during the open season...

The Canadian fishing laws were talked over, and on motion of General Charles Patten, it was voted that had features be brought to the attention of Canadian legislators and that they be asked to afford some relief. The numerous woodmen, who falsely pose as game constables and demand fees for fishing privileges, were mentioned among the drawbacks to Canadian fishing.

Officers for next year were elected as follows: President, Charles R. Skinner, Albany; first vice-president, Alexander Robb, New York; second vice-president, T. R. Kerr, Englewood, N. Y.; secretary, H. Thompson, Alexandria Bay; treasurer, R. F. Grant, Clayton.
