CLAUDE STANDS COUNCIL WILL NOT AGREE TO A CHANGE.

Bell Telephone Company Must Accept the Agreement As It Stands, Or Continue Working Under the Old Understanding.

It seems to be a difficult matter to obtain a quorum of the city council on the afternoon take the notion that the company could be done for want of a sufficient number.

The first reading passed and Ald. Hanson was placed in the chair while the council went into committee of the whole on the second reading.

The council resumed session and it was announced that the by-law had passed the second reading.

The agreement, therefore, stands as it passed council. If the company refuses to accept it, the present agreement will continue in force until July 1st, 1904.
