SEVEN YEARS IS THE TERM GIVEN TO QUACKENBUSH.

He Will Finish Out His Time in the Central Prison and Then Come to Kingston Penitentiary.

Toronto, Aug. 25.—Severe sentences were given Charles Quackenbush and Thomas Murphy, the gang of house- breakers who recently made a daring attempt to escape while being con- veyed in the police van from the court house to the jail. Quackenbush has twenty months still to serve on an unexpired sentence for burglary and six months more in Central Prison for his attempt to escape. After serving this he goes to Kingston for seven years more, the sentence being on three charges of house-breaking on which he was committed.

London, Aug. 25.—Mrs. Florence Maybrick, convicted of poisoning her husband, has just completed fourteen years of her sentence, and subject to good conduct, will be released on July 20th next year. She is now in her forty-second year and enjoys a good health. She has been chiefly occupied in Aylesbury jail in bookbinding. The judge who tried her at the Liverpool assizes and the counsel who defended her, Lord Russell, and Kilgallon, are both dead. Her two children are now nearing twenty years of age.

STONED THEM FRENCH METHODISTS MOB- BED IN MONTREAL.

While Holding An Open Air Ser- vice—The Police Put a Stop to the Disorder and Let Wor- shippers Finish Service.
