WORLD TIDINGS OCCURRENCES RECORDED IN BRIEF FORM. Despatches and Cullings Telling of Events Transpiring in All Parts of the Earth.

The trades and labor congress opens at Brockville to-day. The SS. Torr Head, from Belfast, passed Father Point, inward, 8:50 a.m.

Two professors of the Sofia high school have left for Britain for the purpose of obtaining subscriptions for the relief of the refugees.

It is stated that P. V. Savard, ex-M.P. for Chicoutimi, intends to contest forward as candidate for the now vacant seat of King's, Nova Scotia.

Edward Grant, aged sixty-five, died at the Woodstock hospital of injuries received by falling out of a tree at Currie's Crossing. He leaves a widow and six children.

The amalgamation of Queen's College, St. John's, Nfld., with the University of King's, Nova Scotia, is proposed. Queen's is a divinity school of the diocese of Newfoundland.

THE OLDEST REGIMENT. In British Army Is The Coldstream Guards. Next Thursday the famous Coldstream Guards will visit the city, and a word about the famous regiment to which they belong may be both timely and interesting.

The Coldstream Guards is the oldest regiment in the English army. The present principal officers are Colonel-in-Chief, the king; colonel-general, Sir F. C. A. Stephenson; officer-in-command Colonel A. E. Cudington; Lt.-Colonel, Hon. Heneker Major, C.B., H. C. Sirtes, D.S.O., G. Pleydon-Bouverie.

The regiment was formed in 1650, under General George Monck, by drafts from the Cromwellian regiments of Sir Arthur Haslerig and Colonel George Fenwick of Monck's regiment.

Its earliest battles under the royal colors were fought at sea, portions of the regiment being present at the battles of Harwich, Dunkirk and North Foreland in 1655 and 1666. On land it fought at Sedgemoor against the Duke of Monmouth, at the siege of Namur, at the battles of Malplaquet and Fontenoy.

Later on in the Crimea, the first battalion upheld the traditions of the regiment. "The conduct of the Coldstream Guards at Inkerman, says the Times of November 20, 1854, "should immortalize their names. The battalion went into action with 17 officers and 400 men; of that number eight officers were killed, five wounded, and upwards of 200 rank and file were killed and wounded."

Not only at Inkerman but during the national trans-continental railway fight of 1885, during the recent war in South Africa the regiment was in long and continuous service, being amongst the first on the field, and the last to leave. At the battle of Modder River it was the only regiment who were ordered to cross the river first, and the spectacle of the guardsmen swimming and fording the stream under very heavy fire in full view of both sides was an inspiring sight.

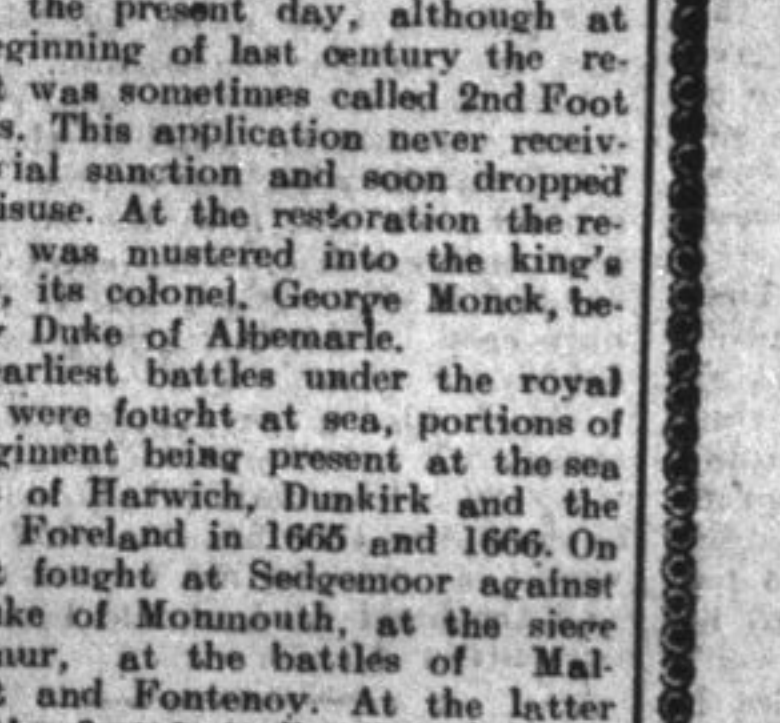
