

London, Oct. 5.-Times says: "The colonies are capable of supplying nearly all our requirements and they are also capable of keeping our factories in full and steady work. Our system of unrestricted imports was the policy of the little Englander, who regarded the colonies as encumberances; we have come to regard them as the brightest jewels in the crown of empire, and we plainly owe it to them as well as ourselves to mark and accentuate a re lationship which both sides may well be proud to claim." The Standard says that so far as appearances go the colonies are quite as anxious, nor should we blame them for it, to levelop their industries, as our foreign riv-


