UNIQUE COLONY

THE CRIMINAL'S HOME IN PROVINCE OF ONTARIO... Penitentiary at Kingston Said to Be The Most Remarkable Institute in North America.

Montreal Herald... Kingston, Ont., claims the distinction of having within its corporate limits what is without doubt the most extraordinary prison in North America.

There are many American criminals in cells there, several of them famous for desperate deeds in half a dozen countries. One historic felon, around whom a considerable romance has been woven, is a prisoner there.

The parole system was established a year ago, and 300 hundred convicts are out under the provisions of the act. The parolee, however, is not a free man.

There are twelve acres in the big prison, and a stone wall twenty feet high surrounds the grounds. It was constructed in 1831, and at several angles beyond the walls are constructed stone towers of defence against an invading foe.

This is not an industrial prison, the men merely work in the United States, and the labor is especially strong and five feet thick. It was intended to withstand the assault of heavy guns from the sea and presents to-day a most formidable front.

There is a Catholic chapel as well as a Protestant church, though the majority of the inmates are Protestants. The prison choir, and the convict organist are well trained.

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Just four times in five years has corporal punishment been enforced by the warden in the penitentiary. That was for insults offered by the prisoners to the guards.
