Examination of these coats showed that they were made of small particles of fur picked up around fur establishments from sweepings, etc., and by dint of much patient labour, pieced together, and made into garments of various kinds. So small were the pieces used, that the goods could not hold together more than a few days, after the purchasers commenced wearing them. Examination showed that a regular business was being made in that line, a factory employing several people being in full swing.
