INSTALLATION OF PRINCIPAL GORDON OF QUEEN'S.

A Brilliant Ceremony—The Principal Received a Great Ovation—Addresses Delivered and Degrees Conferred.

The Very Reverend D. M. Gordon, B.D., was formally installed principal of Queen's University on Thursday afternoon. The brilliant academic function took place in the Grand Opera House in presence of 1,600 people, 14 Conventions hall being too small for such a ceremony.

After a reading and prayer by the chaplain, Chancellor Fleming gave an interesting address on Queen's University history and affairs. When he referred touchingly to the late Principal Grant, the students broke forth into the song of "Auld Lang Syne," which came in most fittingly, and was one of the most pardonable breaks in the speeches.

Five Congratulatory Addresses. Following came five congratulatory addresses. Lieut. Gov. W. Mortimer Clark, tendered his congratulations to Queen's on this their red letter day.
