Germany proposes to prolong the most favored nation agreement between Great Britain and Germany, which expires December 31st. Canada will be excluded from its benefits.

William H. Kennedy, agent for the Lake Erie and Detroit River railway at Kingsville, Ont., ever since the road was constructed, died last night.

E. C. Walker, head of the distillery company, Hiram Walker & Sons, of Walkerville, has declined to accept the conservative nomination in South Essex, in opposition to M. K. Cowan, M.P., tendered him some weeks ago, at a convention in Kingsville.
