

> Election Day In London. London, Nov. 2.-It is something of a coincilence that elections are being held almost simultaneously in London and New York, the two greatest cities of the English-speaking world, and it is especially noteworthy that in London, as in New York, there is an active non-partizan movement, independent of the great national parties, and looking only to the improvement of the affairs of the people.

The election in London for the choice of a city government is being held, to-day. The chief issue is the promotion of the schools and action by the city government for improving the condition of the working classes, the former measure being made the more prominent.

The division is between the moderates and the progressives, the former at present having a majority of the total membership of the borough councils, but the latter have been the more active in the present canvass an hope to reduce the preponderance of the moderates, if they do not secure
