MUM AT BIER. NOT ALLOWED TO SPEAK AT BOOTH-TUCKER FUNERAL.

Twice Pleads For Permission—Leader of Volunteers of America Tries to Arrange for Family Gathering, But Efforts Are In Vain. New York, Nov. 2.—Funeral services over the remains of Emma Booth-Tucker, late consul of the Salvation Army in America, were held on Sunday in Carnegie Hall. The hall was crowded and hundreds waited outside until after the ceremonies, when they were allowed to view the remains.

Herbert Booth, his brother, at the request of the general, remained to represent the family and, if it was convenient, to say a few words to the audience. Herbert Booth twice asked permission from Commander Booth-Tucker to speak, but each time it was refused.

Commander Booth-Tucker and his seven children followed the casket. The commander occupied the centre of the stage during the service. A cablegram from Gen. William Booth, of London, was read at Carnegie Hall. It said, referring to Mrs. Booth-Tucker's death: "Her death is an unutterable loss."

AYLESWORTH ARRIVES. He Reached Toronto To-Day—Re-impose Fees. Toronto, Nov. 2.—A. R. Aylesworth, K.C., arrived from London, Eng., this morning, and was met at the station by members of his firm and of his family, and by a few personal friends.

STRIKE AT NIAGARA. Over Reduction of Wages—Police Called Out. Niagara Falls, Ont., Nov. 2.—A strike occurred this morning, affecting the entire work of construction of three big Canadian power companies, employing about 1,500 men, being the result of an order issued by the contractors taking effect yesterday, reducing the wages of the men from \$1.75 to \$1.50 per day.

Anxiety About Home Missions. Toronto, Nov. 2.—Considerable anxiety is being caused by the state of the Presbyterian Home Mission fund, to October 30th the receipts had not reached within \$5,000 of the amount raised during the corresponding period of the previous year, whereas the expenditure was \$9,500 in excess. The estimated expenditure for the year was \$110,000. Fully one-half of this was required for the first six months. Last year's expenditure was \$94,000. The increase is accounted for by the opening up of new fields and the raising of the status of others, placing them under ordained ministers, whereas they were supplied by students or catechists. The present debt of the Home Mission fund is \$10,000.
