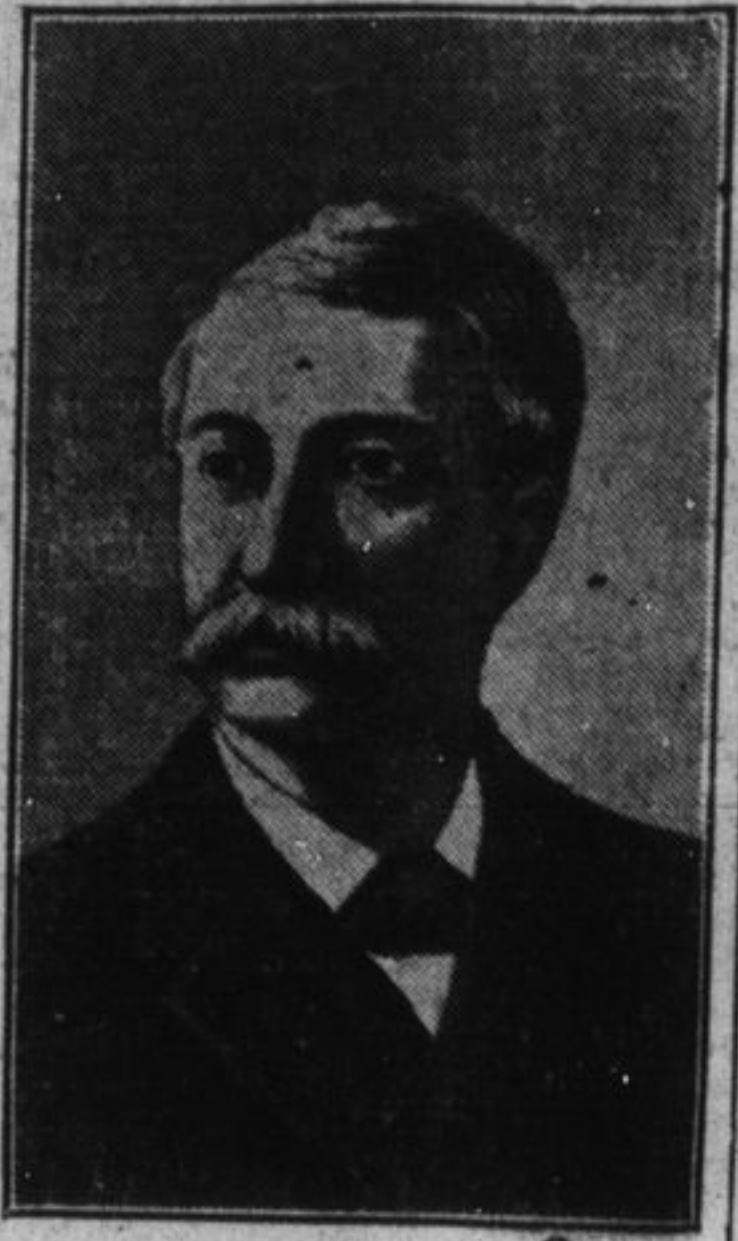

Toronto, Nov. 5.—The examination of A. E. Ames was continued to-day, regarding the failure of the Atlas Loan company, of St. Thomas. Mr. Hunter, counsel for the liquidator, pointed out that in the first balance sheet of profit and loss in American securities, a line was erased, which showed a net loss of \$41,121.84.
