

ABOUT FARM. CORRECTIVE FOOD REQUIRED BY SWINE.

Signs of Rot in The Potato Crop - The Most Suitable Apples to Grow - Importance of Institute Meetings.

Every animal on the farm is worthy of a dry bed. The annual winter provincial fair will be held in Guelph, December 7th to 11th.

Remove flower-pot stains from window sills by rubbing with fine wood ashes, and rinse with clear water. Kansas is said to have 25,000,000 bushels of wheat piled on the ground, waiting for cars to take it away.

The cow that does not give from 350 to 550 pounds of milk a year is not a better cow. The sooner she is taken to the block the better. John Bright's big sale of Short-horns, held at Whitby recently, was a success. The sale totalled nearly \$5,000, or an average of \$144 per head.

In the North-West Territories good lambs have been offered for \$2 a head, and yearling wethers for \$3.25. At such figures there is good money to be made feeding for the early spring trade.

Good crops and good prices for farm stock and produce for several years in succession have placed Canadian farmers in comfortable circum-stances. There are no good reasons why the present good times should not continue.

Last spring quite a number of progressive cattlemen of the Canadian North-West brought from Mexico young stockers to feed on their ranges; so far these men report the result as very satisfactory. It is expected that they will stand the winter well.

Farmers' Institute meetings will be held in Frontenac this month and next on dates already announced. These meetings are of great importance to the farmer, and he cannot afford to be absent from the meeting in his district. There are many important questions to be discussed, and secretaries should make every effort to get the people out.

Farmers who dry apples desire to keep them from turning black. This can be done quite easily. When the slices have been trimmed throw them into an ordinary sized pail which has been about half filled with water in which a handful of common salt has been stirred. As soon as enough apples have been prepared, drain off the water, which can be used again, and dry in the usual manner.

Increasing signs of rot are shown in recent arrivals of potatoes in Toronto. Readily secured lots are few and far between, and dealers are apprehensive of being able to get a sufficient supply. Good potatoes seem to be more plentiful in Quebec, as supplies at Montreal have been liberal. Car lots on track are quoted in Toronto at 55c, to 60c., and about 55c. at Montreal.

In view of the scarcity and high price of apple barrels this season, the Dominion fruit division recommends the general use of boxes. These should not cost more than ten cents each. As three boxes hold about as many apples as a barrel, they will be found much cheaper than barrels at fifty cents each. The boxes should hold about forty pounds of fruit. The dimensions of the boxes used by the Grimsby shippers are nine by twelve by eighteen inches, while the British Columbia standard box is nine by eleven by eighteen inches, inside measurements in both cases.
