LOYALTY AND PATRIOTISM.

The Military Prowess Of the Japanese.

Japan is not a small country and the Japanese are not a weak people. There are some 40,000,000 Japanese, says Quanton's Magazine. The empire contains about 150,000 square miles, or one-quarter more area than England, Scotland and Wales. In other words the Japanese empire is considerably larger than Britain, and contains about 10,000,000 more people. It is fortunate in being an island realm, so that it cannot be attacked except from the sea. This in view of its powerful navy, probably superior to that of Russia gives it a tremendous advantage in war with the northern empire. Again it is so close to the Asiatic continent that it could land its troops in Korea or Siberia much more rapidly than Russia could march them overland, or transport them as the Siberian railway. Again, the 42,000,000 Japanese are more closely knit by national ties, by loyalty and patriotism and zeal than any equal number of people on the face of the globe. In this respect they resemble ancient Sparta, the Dutch in Europe, and the magnificently heroic Boers.

As to their military qualities, it is well known that the Japanese army is not only of considerable size, but that its discipline and equipment are fully equal to that of the French or German forces. The present standing of the army of Japan is something like 600,000 troops, or equal in size to the army of either France or Germany, and in military efficiency it is undoubtedly the superior of either.

It should be remembered that Japan has never been conquered. It should also be remembered that a foot of her soil has never been held by an enemy for an appreciable time. It should also be remembered that the very heroes Genghis Khan and his predecessors and successors led in triumph against Russia and Central Europe, and which overthrew Persia and India and Afghanistan, and Russia and Hungary, were easily beaten by the Japanese. It has been said that the Japanese have never fought a serious war with a white nation, and are unknown quantity. But there is abundant material, for estimating the strength on sea and land of those two peoples. The Japanese in their conflict

throughout the globe, wherever humanity has a champion, and a name. Louis Millard was a machinist, who occupied two rooms in the most decayed part of the city, and lived a hermit in the midst of millions, doing his best for the benefit of the world, the formation of a society for the protection of animals, and yet, from all outside appearance, did not have enough for his own daily bread. At this particular time Eldridge T. Gerry, a wealthy citizen, without forming an association for the protection of dumb animals, and he undertook the management of this noble quest. He framed a code of laws for the association which was consumed by the legislature, and became a law; he bought numerous buildings where sick animals are taken care of, and by his splendid example, associations were formed all over the country, in this cause. The position of the Isthmus of Panama, which is now a republic, is virtually been in American hands for half a century. Nine-tenths of the travel that went to California in the early days, had to cross the most interesting part of what is now a new republic; American capital built the railroad across the isthmus from Aspinwall on the Atlantic side to the old city of Panama on the Pacific. Constant association and the outlay of many millions of capital has been the means of securing a very favorable attitude towards the government of the United States. The French and German interests have never been regarded on the Atlantic side as they have on the Pacific. It was the first nation to recognize the necessity of a ship canal. It was a gigantic undertaking, and demanded hundreds of millions for its completion. The reckless extravagance of those at the head of the enterprise threw the whole affair into the hands of the Lesseps, who had completed the Suez canal, and he and his constituents thought he could complete anything by merely lending his name. This was taken advantage of by sharp and swindlers, who made fortunes without giving a penny. When the villainy could be concealed no longer, the bubble burst. That which had been the richest of gilt-edged securities, became worthless and men who thought themselves fortunate in having found themselves beggars. De Lesseps' name, once a name to swear by, was cursed and hissed until it broke the old man's heart. On investigation splendid engines, locomotives and other contrivances were found buried on the Isthmus. The ruins of the land, brings memories of the Tulip Craze, the South Sea bubble, and the mad speculation of Hudson, the celebrated fur trader. The new organization about to be completed, will serve as a lamp for those who are looking for rapid fortunes, it has been the backing of the greatest republic in existence, and if ever commerce rather than rapacity, the hands of the world, I suppose we shall be able to act as sponsor for the new republic of Panama and abide the success of the event.
