DOMINION MARINE MEN WILL DISCUSS MEASURES.

Sunday Operation—Abolition of Tolls Also To Be Discussed At a Meeting in Toronto in December.

The Dominion Marine Association, organized in Ottawa six months ago, is to hold a meeting in Toronto about the middle of December.

The subject of greatest importance to the Dominion at large, and, therefore, to this association, in connection with marine matters, is the improvement of the St. Lawrence route.

The comparative facilities would then be by the American route: A steamer of 6,000 tons for 900 miles to Buffalo, and barge of 1,000 tons for 450 miles to New York.

The canals are at present closed on Sunday, except after October 1st in each year, when they are opened to permit as large a portion as possible of the harvest to get to market before the close of inland navigation.
