SCOTCH NIGHT ST. ANDREW'S SOCIETY CONCERT AND DANCE

Held in The City Hall—A Large Audience Present—Sweet Singing, Bright Speeches and Merry Dances.

The revival of the old St. Andrew's night celebration by the Kingston Scotchmen was welcomed, as attested by the large assembly in the city hall Monday night for St. Andrew's Society concert and dance.

At a quarter past eight o'clock, Pipe-Major Beaton, of the 48th Highlanders struck up "The Cook of the North," and a moment later the St. Andrew's Highland cadets, in command of Captain Hughes, and with the piper at their head, marched into the hall proceeded up two aisles in single file and took up position on the platform.

Rev. Dr. Mackie extended to the audience a hearty welcome to the hall which was to be their Scottish home for the night. He said that he succeeded a long line of illustrious men as president of a line that extended back to 1840 and contained citizens of high standing and also men of world-wide repute who had been rulers of Canada.

The programme of seventeen numbers was almost completely Scotch, the only breaks being three songs, specialties which made a pleasing variety. Pipe-Major Beaton gave four selections that were appreciated even by those who do not understand the piping of Highland instrument and music.

At half past ten o'clock "Auld Lang Syne" and "God Save the King" were sung, and half an hour later the dance began, fully two hundred waiting for this part of the night's entertainment. The 47th orchestra furnished music, and no better has ever been heard here.
