GOLD FOUND IN LARGE QUANTITIES AT WEBBWOOD.

Veins Rocky To Sixty Feet Wide—Rock Everywhere Yields "Calors"—Exodus From Both Soos to Shakespear Mine. Sault Ste. Marie, Dec. 1.—The Soos in all erag oved has been brought in by a party of local business men, who have returned from a trip to the newly-discovered gold fields at Webbwood, Ont., a short distance from here. The story brought home by these investigators fully corroborates the rumors which have been rife of late, concerning the discovery of some wonderfully rich veins of gold-bearing quartz. To substantiate their story, members of the party are exhibiting samples of the rock which show free gold without the aid of a glass. Several pieces of the quartz have been pulverized and panned, and in every case "calors" were found in surprising quantities.

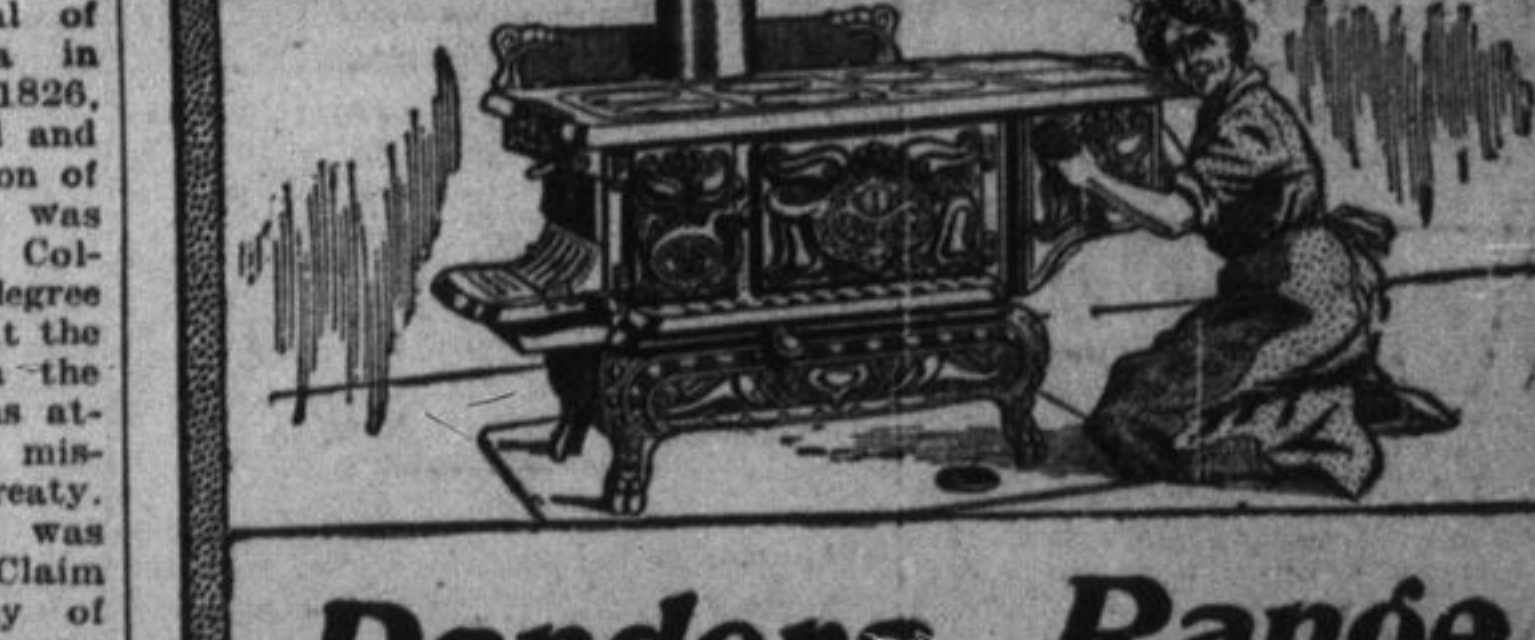
