The sub-committee appointed to consult with the city solicitor, presentsented a report which embraced the city solicitor's opinion. This was conwhich the agreement between the city and company, as well as legislative acts were reviewed. One clause read as follows: "The municipal act expressly provides that every council shall make to the owners or occupiers of or other persons interested in real preperty inriously affected by the exercise of its (the city's) powers, due compensation for any damages necessarily resulting from the exercise of such powers; and any claim for such compensation, not mutually agreed upon, shall be de termined by arbitration." No compensation, the report continued, can be claimed for injury resulting from the operation of the railway after being laid. 
