USED POISON. A DISTRESSING MURDER CRAZE IN MICHIGAN.

Eight Deaths Are Laid to Women - 18-Year-Old Bride Admits Slaying Husband of Three Weeks.

Detroit, Mich., Dec. 10.-Modern prototypes of Lucretia Borgia are responsible for eight deaths from poisoning which have occurred in Michigan within the past few days.

Two other cases of poisoning, in both of which women are implicated, are still under investigation. The known cases are: Mrs. Mary McKnight of Kalkaska, charged with poisoning her brother, his wife and her child.

Mrs. Caroline Collins of Owosso, charged with poisoning a hired man. Mrs. Kati Ludwick of Bronson, guilty of murdering her husband, according to her own confession.

Mrs. Emma Stewart of Big Rapids, suspected of being responsible for the death of her husband, who died from strychnine poisoning. At Colfax, Mich., Mrs. Kati Ludwick, whose husband died three weeks after their marriage in Bronson township, was arrested and brought to the county jail, charged with murder.

John Ludwick, of Bronson township, was married about three weeks ago to Katie Bistry, aged eighteen, both are Polish. She had seen him only four times previous to their marriage.

Last Thursday she says she administered the poison and her husband died Saturday. He was alone at the time, and the wife attended a wedding while he remains lying neglected in the house.

George Stewart, a farmer, living five miles east of Big Rapids, aged about forty, was taken suddenly ill and died in convulsions before a doctor could reach him. Arrangements had been made for the funeral when it was determined to hold an investigation, it having been learned that Stewart's wife recently purchased some strychnine and some quinine.

HELEN KELLER Smelled a Train Nobody Could Hear or See. New Brunswick, Dec. 10.-During a visit to Miss Helen Keller, the blind deaf mute, who resides at the Metuchen home of Henry M. Alden, editor of Harper's Magazine, she astonished her friend, Miss Annie Alden, by suddenly rising from her seat on the porch and saying in the peculiar tones which she has learned to produce: "There goes a railroad train."

In a recent article of this series attention was called to the disturbance caused by sun-spots in the magnetism of the earth. CATTLE MEN OF THE WEST MEET AT GUELPH.

Canadian Hereford and Shorthorn Breeders in Convention-Commence Action of U.S. re. Stud Books, Also British Embargo. Guelph, Ont., Dec. 10.-The thirtieth annual meeting of the Canadian Hereford Breeders' Association, was held here, yesterday, at which a resolution was passed protesting against the treasury department ruling in preventing Canadian breeders from selling cattle in the United States, and especially at the St. Louis exposition, making it necessary for the cattle to return to Canada before they could be delivered to the purchasers, free of duty.

At a public meeting in the city hall last night in connection with the provincial winter fair, M. J. P. Downey, M.P.P., and Hugh Guthrie, M.P., declared that in fact any move for a mutual reduction of agricultural duties by the United States, dealing with the embargo on Canadian cattle, Dr. Rutherford, chief of the Dominion veterinary staff, said the agitation among Scottish feeders was for their own gain, not for ours.

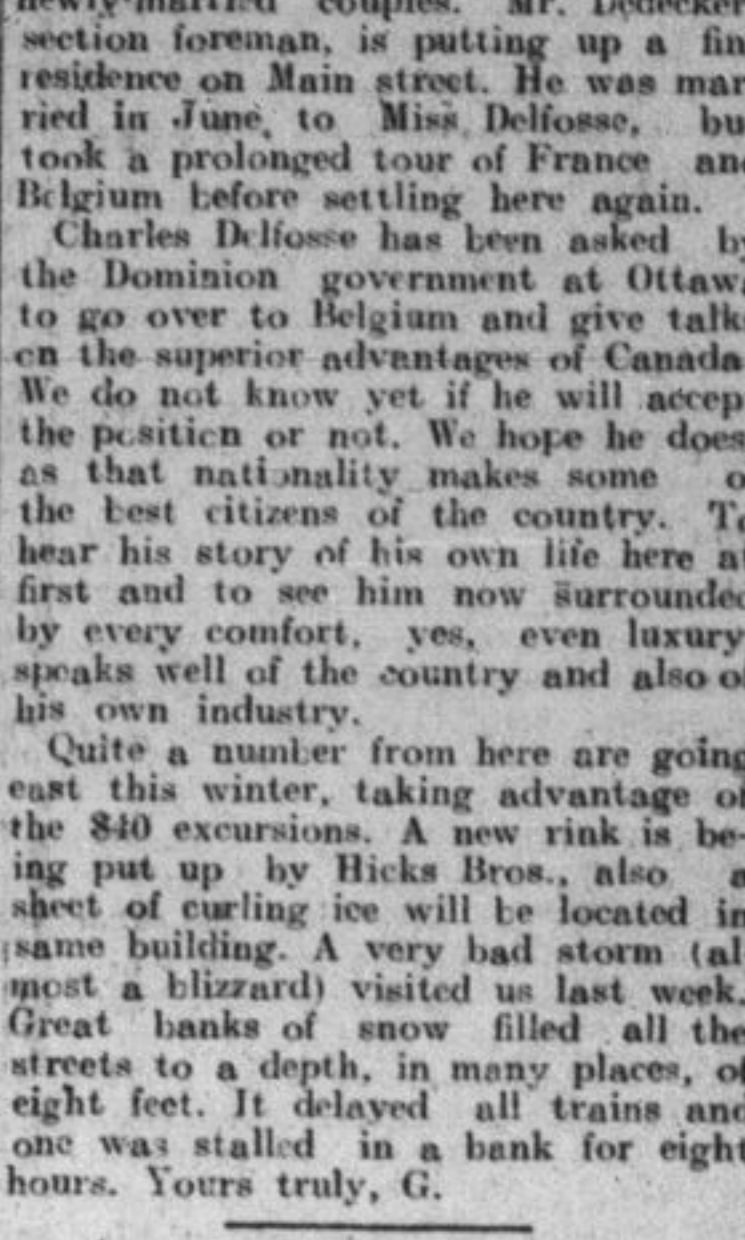
