the presidency itself. William Randolph Hearst is the man who is trying to do this. He has been at it a long time and he has made more headway than most people sup-





Toronto, Jan. 13 .- At the Canadian Institute on Saturday evening Kivas Tully, C.E., read a paper on "Fluctuations of Lake Ontario," Mr. Tully based his remarks upon official re cords and personal observations covering a space of fifty years, and dealt with the physical conditions which determine and cause fluctuations in levels of all great lakes. There had, he pointed out, been a gradual diminution in the rain and snow fall, amounting from 1858 to 1893 to 2,602 inches, and from 1893 to 1903 to 1.583 inches. Toronto harbor records during the same period show a lowering of the water level of Lake Ontario of 13.61 inches. This demands close scrutiny and inquiry, as the discrepancy is not explained by a reduction in rain and snow fall.


