The tea which Lady Tilley was to have given to-day, for Miss Gordon, has been postponed owing to the death of a near relative of Lady Tilley.

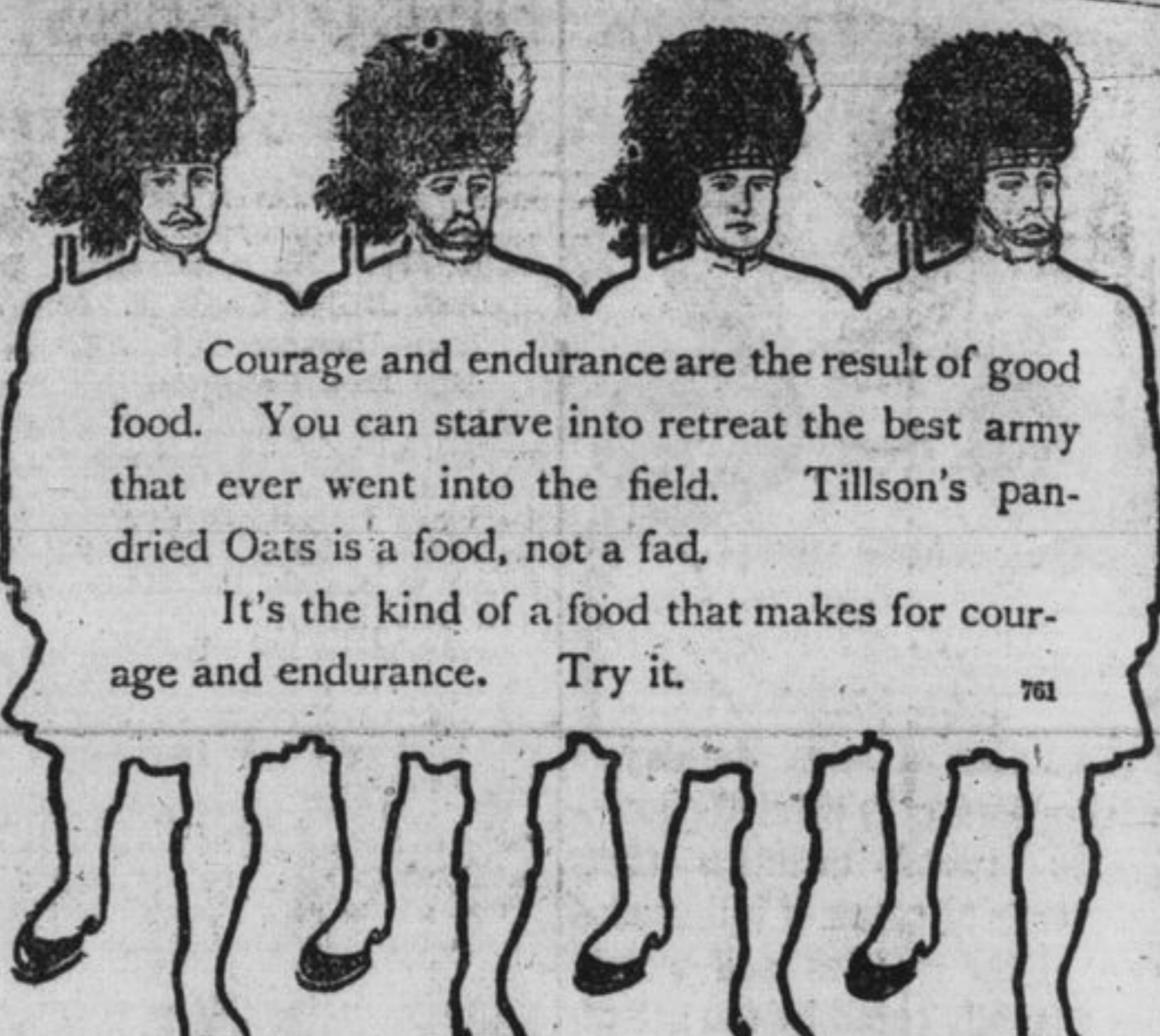
Of course only a French woman would venture to wear anything so entirely novel; but from across the water comes the information that blouses entirely woven of chain are established as a new fashion.
