**CLEAR REVIEW
 OF THE LIGHT HEAT AND
 POWER QUESTION.**

M. S. Burnette Maintains That the
 Company Will Win Its Appeal
 —His Reasons For So Holding—
 Kingston, Feb. 8.—(The Editor):
 Once more upon the soil of the Line-
 stone city, I find the historic old
 town convulsed over the litigation
 now before the privy council. In your
 issue of the 4th inst., is to be found
 an interesting review of the subject
 matter, and so with your permission
 I will continue the review. I am inter-
 ested in the dispute simply as a citi-
 zen and a member of the legal fran-
 chise. All law suits are more or less
 interesting both to the legal and the
 lay mind, and I find this one after
 considerable examination to be es-
 pecially important.

The question now before the highest
 court in the empire is whether or not
 the city is liable to pay the sum of
 eighty thousand dollars, the amount
 of the franchise was valued by the
 board of arbitrators. I think that
 the non-readers of the Whig are
 more or less familiar with the facts
 of the case, and certainly only a
 few of the many points involved could
 be stated in an ordinary newspaper
 article. I will begin my review by re-
 marking that the franchise in ques-
 tion is in the law, a franchise by
 the good-will, and a statutory fran-
 chise. The franchise in this case is a
 statutory one, which is the strongest
 kind of a franchise, and it might be
 best to remark that the franchise
 we mean an exclusive right to
 transact some particular business
 in a given locality for a stated time.

An numerous papers which I
 have drafted in connection with the
 past year are not before me, but I
 give you a few facts trusting to the
 memory. In March, 1888, an act
 was passed by the then parliament
 of Canada, creating a corporation
 styled the Kingston Gas and Light
 company, and conferring upon that
 company a statutory franchise for the
 period of fifty years as stated in your
 issue of the 4th inst. In 1886 the
 legislature of this province passed an
 act incorporating a corporation styled
 the Kingston Electric Light company,
 a company entirely separate and dis-
 tinct from the gas company above
 mentioned, and gave this company a
 perpetual franchise. On the 31st of
 October, 1889, the two companies last
 above mentioned, were amalgamated
 under the name and style of "The
 Kingston Light, Heat and Power com-
 pany," and by an act of the Ontario
 house, March 4th, 1891, this new and
 amalgamated company was given a
 charter and a statutory franchise for
 the period of twenty years, expiring
 in May, A.D. 1911. It is this franchise
 that is now in dispute, and was val-
 ued at eighty thousand dollars by the
 arbitrators, Judges Price, McDougall
 and McTavish.

We have now come in the course of
 our review to the initial stage of this
 important litigation. For some time
 prior to the year 1890 the Kingston
 Light, Heat and Power company had
 been lighting the streets of the city.
 This contract to so light the streets
 of the city was to expire, as my mem-
 ory serves me, on January 1st, 1897.
 The company was, on January 1st, 1897,
 renewed and were met with this
 proposition on the part of the city.
 Yes, we will renew the contract with
 this qualification, namely, that upon
 the expiration of a new contract for
 five years we have the privilege of tak-
 ing over, or expropriating, as the legal
 phrase goes, the entire works, plant,
 appliances and property of the said
 Light, Heat and Power company. It
 was just here, I think in the month
 of July, 1896, that the new contract
 was entered into, to take effect on the 1st
 of January following that is the sub-
 ject-matter of the difficulty and
 litigation. This agreement was a col-
 lengthily document, and is patterned
 in many of its features after other
 agreements of the same nature in other
 cities in Canada and England. The
