Hong Kong, Feb. 23.—Baron De Rosen, lately the Russian minister at Tokyo, and the Russian military and naval attaches and consul, arrived here yesterday, from Japan on their way to Russia; Baron De Rosen interviewed, said that the naval fight at Chemulpo was a breach of neutrality and a cowardly action on the part of the Japanese who knew, before the declaration of war, the exact date which they were going to attack and land at Chemulpo. An important point, he said, lay in the fact that the Japanese had been holding for many months the telegraph line of Korea, in spite of the fact that Korea was a perfectly neutral country. Admiral Alexio suspected the Japanese of intercepting a telegram in cipher, ordering the Varang to leave Chemulpo, and return to Port Arthur. This telegram was never received and the Varang remained in ignorance of the situation until the Japanese warships arrived.

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A View Of Chemulpo.

TWENTY-TWO SAVED.

A British Steamer at the Storm's Mercy.

New York, Feb. 23.—The German

Sloman Line steamer Alano, Capt. Kunkelhoff, from Hamburg, brought to port Capt. Raymond Parker, and twenty-one shipwrecked men of the British freight steamer Kentigen, whom they abandoned at sea on Sunday morning, left Hamburg February 3rd with a general cargo, but no passengers. She experienced very stormy weather and on February 16th at 7 a.m. sighted the Kettengen of Glasgow, flying distress signals. She was rolling heavily and had a heavy list. She signalled "Wish to abandon ship."

"We launched a lifeboat in charge of our chief officer and four men, and with considerable difficulty succeeded in rescuing Capt. Parker and nine men," said Capt. Kunkelhoff. "Meanwhile the Kentigen launched one of her boats with twelve men, twelve members of her crew, who managed to come alongside and were taken on board the Alano, saving nothing but the clothes they stood in."
