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HUNTING BY DOGS.

Third series of working trials of the Association of Bloodhound Trials to be held within the next few days in a remote part of Warwickshire, and although Croxton Smith has not been inundated with applications to witness the trials, as was the case on the occasion of the gathering on the Yorkshire Wolds in 1898, sportsmen and women—as well as police authorities—in various parts of the country have shown interest in the meeting by asking for particulars of the place where hounds throw off in the two stakes scheduled for decision. For many reasons a crowd is not desirable, and although Croxton Smith is issuing invitations to those really interested, every effort is being made to avoid the collection of a local crowd.

There are nine entries in the two stakes, the larger one being that for single hounds, to be tested on a trail line of about one mile in length. In this stake the hounds will run in couples, and there is little doubt that emulation thus created will heighten interest in the competition, for hounds will naturally race for the lead.

The second stake will be in the shape of a change test for single hounds, an arrangement having been made by which the line originally laid will be crossed, and re-crossed, by a stranger man, with a view to testing the ability of the competing hounds to hold a line of three miles laid an hour previously.
