AFTER SHIPS.

Canadians Will Be Trained For Navy.

THE MINISTER

IS GOING TO CONSULT THE ADMIRALTY.

Nearly Six Million In Public Works—Expenditure Public Works Shows Slight Increase Over Previous Year.

LONDON, March 10.—The annual report of the public works department for the past fiscal year has been issued. There was an expenditure on the department during the year of \$5,000,000. This does not include an advance of \$800,000 to the Montreal harbor commission, which was the same last year. In 1899 there was an expenditure of \$5,469,000. There was \$887,190 spent in dredging last year. More than half this was in Ontario. There was \$258,776 spent on deepening the St. Lawrence ship channel. The expenditure on public buildings last year was \$1,529,000.

Hon. Raymond Préfontaine, minister of marine and fisheries, will leave for England next summer to confer with the admiralty officials for the purpose of obtaining two British war cruisers on which to train Canadians for the navy. This is in connection with the bill which the minister of marine will introduce during the coming session to establish a navy in Canada. One of the cruisers will be placed on the Atlantic and the other on the Pacific.

NINTH TO DIE.

Violent Death of Merchant Recalls Fatalities.

SOUTH BEND, IND., March 10.—A singular coincidence in the murder of the druggist, William Runyan, is the fact that he is the ninth member of the Fourth Ward Thirtieth club to meet a violent death. The Thirtieth club was originally composed of thirteen boys, ranging in age between seven and ten years, all of whom resided in the same neighbourhood.

The members of the club who are dead are: John Embick, who died suddenly after undergoing a surgical operation; Schuyler Embick, who was accidentally killed at the plant of the South Bond & Bolt works; Frederick Madison, who held a clerical position at the Beckinger grocery, committed suicide by shooting himself; John Coal was found dead in Chicago; Ed Speer was crushed to death beneath a brick wall at the Birdsell plant; William Haverly was found dead in a gasoline explosion, and William Runyan, the ninth to die, was murdered two weeks ago last night.

The living members of the Thirtieth club are Frederick Foster, Ed. Foster, Gus Muessol Kropp and Will J. Hart.

THE PRIMATE DEAD.

Pneumonia Cause of Archbishop MacRae's Death.

WINNIPEG, March 10.—Eight Rev.

Robert MacRae, archbishop of Rupert's Land, and primate of all Canada, died, last evening, of pneumonia, after an illness of only two days. The late archbishop was born at Aberdeen in 1831, and was educated at King's College, Aberdeen, and Cambridge. He was consecrated bishop of Rupert's Land in 1865, the diocese containing two million square miles, from which seven dioceses have since been created. In 1893, at the first synod he presided over, he was elected primate of the Church of England in Canada, and was elected primate of the Unionist party compelled the British government to withdraw a favored amendment to avoid defeat.
