Occurrences Recounted in Brief Form.

Prof. George Brown, formerly of Syracuse university, a patient in the state hospital at Middletown, N.Y., who attempted suicide on Monday, departed with coal dust so that their guards mistook them for fremen.

Canon Welch, speaking at the noon-day lenten service in St. James' cathedral, Toronto, said that he believed legislation was necessary to deal with the supererogation, but that it could not be made active unless sustained by public opinion.

Premier McBride, of British Columbia, thinks the Imperial government should have consulted British Columbia before agreeing to allow Chinese labor in South Africa, and declares that the people of Eastern Canada know little or nothing of the question.

The Dominion government steamer Quadra arrived at Victoria on Thursday night from Quatsino Sound, having on board the passengers of the steamer Queen City, which is at present lying at anchor in the harbor.

The provincial secretary's department has sent out a circular to all license inspectors throughout the province calling upon them to strictly enforce the liquor license law.

The circular adds that it is expected that inspectors will take action in the direction of procuring enforcement of the law and in dealing with violators of it without waiting for formal complaint.

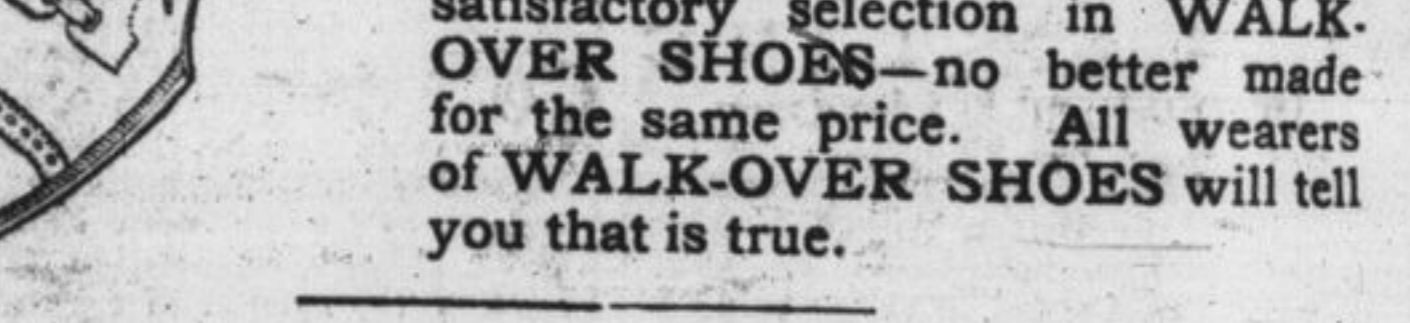
