THE FIRST TRIP OF THE SEASON BY THE OLD PIERREPONT.

Got Across To The Islands—The Ice Is Wearing Fast Away—Wind and Rain Cut Channels Into It. The harbor was quite inviting this morning for the steamer Pierrepont, the hero of dozens of successful attacks, to go out to battle against the ice which has kept navigation closed since the latter part of December.
