Even as late as 1846, ten cents was charged in the United States for carrying letters distances over three hundred miles, 1731, a fortnightly mail was established between Tobolsk and Moscow, 1.200 miles; while, at about the same time, mails were carried between New York and Boston, 250 miles, only once in two weeks. In 1784, the mail carriers of England travelled three miles and a hall an hour, while in Siberia it was from eight to ten miles an hour, two hundred miles a day being no uncommon speed.

SHE WANTS EPIDERMIS

St. Paul Woman . Will Pay \$100 An Inch For It.

Dr. A. J. Fulton, of Brooklyn, advertises that he will pay \$300 for three inches of perfectly healthy skin of a brunette female, and declares that absolute secrecy in the transactions

Dr. Fulton has a patient who needs the three inches of skin and who wants it right away. She is a St. Paul wo-man who has been under Dr. Fuiton's

unusual operation. It is not to cover a burned spot, but to heal and hide a great ulcer caused by lupus, a skin disease, somewhat resembling cancer, but without cancerous malignity and the tissue destroying effect of cers. In the case of Dr. Fulton's pa tient the lupus has been of long standing. It began in the form of numerous nadules, that finally broke down and formed one large ulcerous sore. This has been treated but ineffectually so far as healing is concerned.

The granulated surface of the ulcer has been brought to a healthy condition by proper treatment, but the size of the ulcer was such that it seemed unlikely that skin would grow over it for years, if at all.

The patient is a woman of social position and it has been a great affliction in more than a physical way, as the ulcer is on the throat and under the chin. Because it is on an ex posed part, she wants it covered with skin to match her own brunette complexion. Dr. Fulton says this is important, inasmuch as skin of lighter pigment would show up like a white patch on the darker skin.

The person who parts with skin for \$100 an inch must be in perfect health. Every applicant, with skin to sell, will e examined for blood taint, as it would make matters worse to graft on skin that would inoculate the patient with impure blood. The woman who sells her skin will not be inconvenienced to any large extent, Dr. Fulton says. 
