New York, April 19.—Fur manufacturers are now busy preparing their stock for next winter's use, and their salesmen will start on the road with samples in two or three weeks. All the manufacturers expect an excellent season, and base their hopes on the fact that furs will be much cheaper this year than last year.

The March sales of raw furs which takes place in London, and on which the prices for the year are based over most of the civilized world, showed a mark decline in furs all this year, except on seal, which is steady on beaver, badger, chinchilla, and opossum, which maintained their prices or showed a slight advance, and on ermine.
