has become such a whirl of toil and excitement Our sympathy must be with those who desire to guard it against the apprehended encroachments of an intensely commercial world. But they must remember that the state in Canada, happily for both church end state, is unsectarian, an leaves all citizens perfectly free to take their own course in matters of religioa. Those who do not believe the Sabbath cannot be compelled b law to keep the day like those who do. They can only be compelled in the interest of society at large to respect the Day of Rest. Nor can any man be compelled by law to spend the day in religious exercises, or, if he does not to spend it in listlessness and gloom. It is perhaps not generally known how peculiarly Puritan the belief in the "Sabbath" is. The reign of Edward VI in England was a period of strong Protestant acendancy in regul ations relating to the church. Yet statute of that reign, 5th and 6th of Edward VI., chapter III., respecting the observance of holidays, uses the name "Sunday." not "Sabbath." and proceeds to enact, "That it shall be lawful to every husbandman, leoorer, fisherman, and to all and every other person or persons of what estate, de gree, or condition he or they be uped the holy day's aforesaid, in harvest, or at any other time in the year when necessity shall require, to labor, ride fish or work any kind of work, at their free will and pleasure; anything in this act to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding." It does not seem that in Canada at present Sunday is ill-kept or that there is any interference with its religious observance by those who are minded so to observe it.
