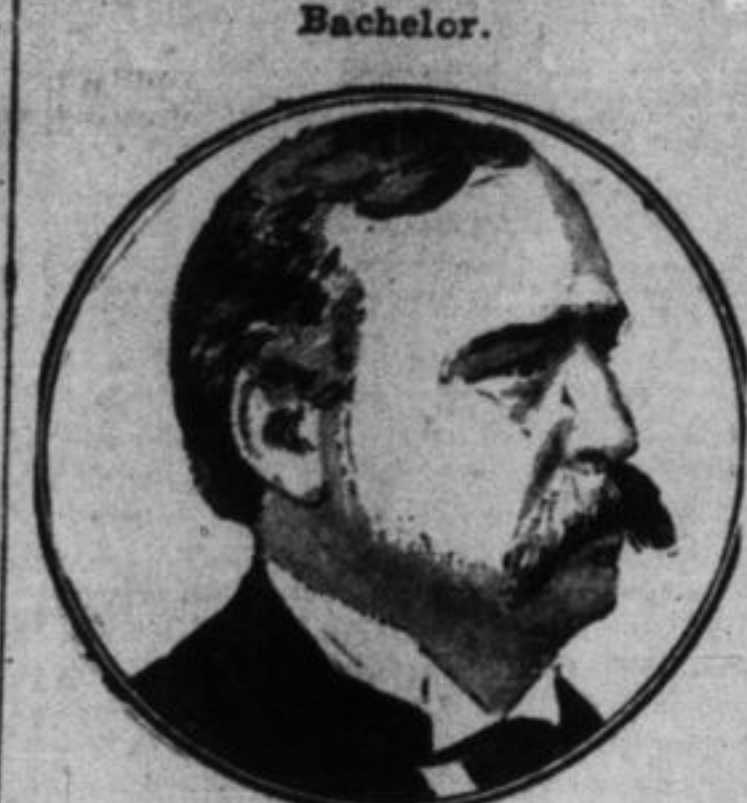

Her Grace of Sutherland is the daughter of the fourth Earl of Rosslyn. She was married to the Duke of Sutherland when he was Marquis of Stafford.

The duchess sought the acquaintance of the socialist lecturer, and a warm friendship was the result of their meeting. The duchess has taken an active part in several movements having for their object the relief of the afflicted working classes.

A HOT BATTLE.

Are Suspended.

New York, May 10.—The firm of Floyd, Crawford & Co. was suspended by the board of the Consolidated Stock Exchange, pending further investigation. The firm has about twenty-five branches in the United States, and one in Montreal.

Officers Quit Liners.

Have, May 10.—In accordance with the decision of a committee appointed by the officers of the Merchant Marine now on strike, the officers of the French line steamers St. Simon, Labrador, Canada, l'Aquatine and Ferdinand de Lesseps have left their vessels. The officers of La Savoie will leave that vessel, but the French line is confident that it will be able to make arrangements by which the ship will sail as usual next Saturday.

Branded A Thief.

New York, May 10.—Thomas Costello, who for twenty-eight years has been a clerk in the paymaster's department of the Brooklyn navy yard, pleaded guilty to the theft of \$392 and was sentenced to serve five years in Sing Sing and pay a fine of \$5,000.

The Southern states are producing half the lumber cut in America. British India now employs over 1,000,000 people in its cotton industries. After paying a fine of \$248,335 for infringement of the business of the railroad, the British union of railroad employees had \$1,330,000 left on deposit in the bank.

HARD COAL CHEAPER.

James Swift & Co. Break Away From The Combine. The price of hard coal is no longer uniform in Kingston. The combine, which has existed for several years, sustained a break on Monday when James Swift & Co. decided to lower the price of hard coal from \$7 to \$6.50 a ton.

Invitation For Fourth Year.
