

AN ENEMY'S TESTIMONY To Good Work Done By Government of Ontario.

The people ordinarily overlook the necessities of provincial administration. They forget that the government has assumed large responsibilities that might have been shifted on to the shoulders of the municipalities. The maintenance of asylums and reformatories requires a large sum each year. The grants to hospitals and charities involve an increased appropriation annually. The government might easily evade these expenditures or tax the municipalities for such purposes. Generous treatment has been accorded the agricultural interests, with the most satisfactory results. The products of the farm have in creased, in some cases, one hundred per cent. by reason of the education al campaign conducted by the depart ment. These facts justify the expenditures of the past, and the continuance of an aggressive campaign in the future. For that purpose money is essential. Education has been liberally supported. For grants to schools, and for the administration of the department a large sum is annually required. Services such as we have enumerated are progressive their demands.
