London Military Critics Wonder At Japan's Apparent Idleness - Kouropatkin With Marshall Fate-Jap Squadron Near Now Chwang.

Nothing, according to the critic, can explain their want enterprise, except the conclusion that all is not yet ripe for a decisive at tack in the extreme north. Gen. Kour opatkin's and other Russian reports are, however, regarded as showing that the movements of the Japanese in the north are daily becoming more threatening, menacing Gen.
