New Ontario Notes.

R. McIntyre, fruit-grower, of Niagara-on-the-lake, returned from two months' prospecting in the Abitibi district, enthusiastic regarding the climate and soil.

The survey of the Temiscamingue railroad and its location north from New Liskeard to where the Grand Trunk Pacific will cross north of Lake Abitibi is in progress.

The Victorian Order of Nurses has donated \$2,000 towards an hospital in New Liskeard. The first newspaper for that town, The Temiscamingue Herald, has appeared, and is owned by John Sharp, formerly of Queen's, Kingston.

Two summer camps are being conducted at Lake Abitibi. Mr. Cochrane, physical instructor of Upper Canada College, conducts one with about sixty pupils, from Ontario, with about six from ten to twenty years, and Dr. Gregg Clarke of Asheville, N.C., has a similar camp of United States youths. These pupils are taught athletics, fitted for every day life as well as given thorough discipline.
