The Tidings From Various Points In Eastern Ontario—What People Are Doing And What They Are Saying.

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OVER CANADA.

PLANS CONSUMMATED BY MACKENZIE AND MANN.

The Biggest Missing Link Is Now Arranged To Be Placed—The Complete Plan.

Messrs. Mackenzie and Mann are known to have cherished for many years plans for a transcontinental railway project. It now appears that their ambition is to be soon realized. That is the inference from plans filed at the railway department yesterday. The plans are for a road which will form a connecting link between the Mackenzie and Mann line of the maritime provinces and the Canadian Northern, the road with which they have tapped the wheat fields of the North-West, and which they aim to push on to the Pacific.

The connecting link is the Quebec, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia railway, which was incorporated last year. The bill being looked after by H. J. Logan, M.P., the representative of Cumberland. The plans for this road which have just been filed indicate its route. It will start at a point on the Great Northern railway near Quebec and crossing the Quebec bridge follows the valley of the Etchemin boundary. It crosses the state of Maine in almost a straight line to the town of Woodstock, N.B., on the St. John river. The valley of the river is followed down to Fredericton, the capital of the province, and from there the road is to run to Moncton traversing the northern portions of the counties of Westmorland and Cumberland to Pugwash. This is the extent of the projected Quebec, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

Connecting with the Atlantic at the eastern end is to be obtained by securing running rights on a short section of the Intercolonial between Pugwash and New Glasgow. At the latter town connection will be secured with the line Mackenzie and Mann are building to Country Harbor, a fine seaport in the province of Nova Scotia. However, this is not the only eastern seaport that is to be made use of for the plans show a branch from J.A.A. the city of St. John, the chief winter port of the dominion at the present time.

The Quebec, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia at the western end will be connected with the Canadian Northern by means of the Great Northern, the Canada Atlantic and the Lakes and Intercolonial. It is understood that this portion of the connection has been arranged for. The plans which were filed with the minister of railways to-day bear the signature of D. D. Mann.
