The last chapter in the Brown-Babeck shooting fray and family feud was concluded this morning at the court house when Brown appeared before Judge Price in the county judge's criminal court.

The evidence for the prosecution was much the same as during the police court proceedings.

Charles Babeck, the eleven-year-old son of the man who claims he was shot at, was brought up from the police station, where he has been locked up on a charge of robbing a freight car near the K. & P. station yesterday afternoon.
