#### A WOMAN'S ACTION.

Married a Man, And Then a Woman.

London, Aug. 15.—A small, wizened,

figure, neatly dressed in a lounge suit

and carrying a bowler hat and a brief

case, strolled nonchalantly into the

dock at Westminster police court yes-

terday.

It was Catherine Coombes, aged six-

ty-eight, who half a century ago re-

nounced the clothing which distin-

guished her sex, cut her hair, and de-

clined henceforth to play a man's part

on the stage of life. She was charged

with being drunk and disorderly.

In the courtroom where she was

brought by a constable, who thought

her a most pugnacious little man, she

created a dramatic surprise by declar-

ing that she was a woman. "I have

been a good woman, too, in my

time," she added.

A detective who asked for a remand

in order to inquire into her case, said

she had been in the workhouse and in

prison. This prompted the magistrate

to make the remark that "it would be

interesting to know whether she went

to prison as a man or a woman."

Coombes has had an interesting past.

Four years ago she swaggered into

the Rochester police station, with her hat rakishly tilted on one side,

smoking a briar pipe. She had her

key whispered in his horrified ears that

she was a woman who had been forty-five

years old in male attire.

She said she was called "Charley

Wilson," and that she had worked on

board ship, and as a "painter" de-

cator.

She had been married as a woman

at the age of fifteen to one Percival

Coombes. Many years after, when she

had acquired a manly bearing, she

captivated the heart of a woman, who

was attracted by her kindly dispo-

sition. They were married and lived

fourteen years at Huddersfield.

To other accomplishments she

adds a knowledge of dock-laboring and

printing.

She was remanded, the £20 bail ask-

ed for not being forthcoming.
