NAVAL BATTLE

IS NOW IN PROGRESS AT PORT ARTHUR

Russian Boats Made Another Dash For Liberty—Were Intercepted And a Battle Fought—Russian Warship Novik Sunk.

Special to the Whig. Washington, D.C., Aug. 15.—A report has been received by the state department that another naval battle is in progress at Port Arthur. It is stated that the Russian warships, driven back to Port Arthur made another dash for liberty early this morning.

Routed Vladivostok Fleet.

Tokio, Aug. 15.—A despatch to the admiralty from the naval establishment of Takashiki, says Admiral Kamimura met the Vladivostok squadron twenty miles from Ulsan, Korea, at five o'clock Sunday morning. The battle ended at 10.30 a.m. The Russian steamer, her bow standing up, was seen to be on fire.

Sunk The Craft.

Cheloo, Aug. 15.—(10.30 a.m.)—An unconfirmed report which was reached here from Tsingtau says the Russian cruiser Novik, which put into Tsingtau after the battle of August 10th, off Port Arthur, and which sailed for Tsingtau, was sunk for forty miles from Tsingtau.

Chinese Bandits Moving.

Mukden, Aug. 15.—The Chinese bandit leaders Itushan, Tulisan and Fonggo, each with a thousand followers, are now in the Shanniating district, moving up the Liao river valley with the object of attacking the railway.

A Period Of Grace.

Berlin, Aug. 15.—The foreign office informs the Associated Press that if the Russian ships which put into Tsingtau do not make repairs and leave that port within the time allotted them they will be detained there until the Russian vessels have been notified to that effect.
