ITS SCHOOLS THEY ARE REALLY QUITE UP-TO-DATE

Established and Worked Under Difficulties. They Compare Well With Eastern Schools—A Few Facts And Figures Concerning Them.

We think and read and talk of Yukon gold, and Yukon cold, and many other characteristics of the Arctic territory, but it is an eye-opener to find in the Yukon Gold, a new paper published in Dawson, a report of schools in that country, which would be creditable in the east.

The number of schools is eleven, and of teachers eighteen. The former are situated at Dawson, St. Mary's, Whitehorse, Grand Forks, Shalabur, Grandville, Thirty Below Bonanza, Gold Bottom, Last Chance, Seventy-four Below Discovery, Dominion and Caribou, and the latter get salaries from the \$3,000 paid T. G. Bragg, R.A., and R. E. Seville, R.A., of Dawson, high school, to the \$200 paid at Whitehorse.
