Policy Of The Congo Free State Attacked.

Boston, Oct. 8.—King Leopold, of Belgium, was assailed for his policy as sovereign of the Congo Free State at a public meeting held in connec-tion with the sessions of the International Peace Congress.

The attack was made by E. Morel, of England, who represented the Cougo Reform Association. Mr. Morel charged that the king was per-sonally responsible in a large mea-sure for cruelties practised on the natives of the Congo Free State in rom the country all the ivory

Professor Of Cornell Creates Unique Fund-Will Help Destitute People.


