CANNONADING GOES ON FIERCELY ALONG ENTIRE FRONT.

Russians Think Kuropatkin's Greater Numbers Must Tell—Mogun May Get Oyama's Place—Japanese Gunboat Lost—Mogun Gets Credit.

Special to the Whig. A Mukden despatch, dated yesterday, says: A bloody battle is now raging about six miles north of Yentai railroad.

A Temporary Check. St. Petersburg, Oct. 12. (2:10 a.m.)—Severe fighting north of Yentai, resulting in temporary check of Gen. Kuropatkin's advance.

HE WILL GO BACK. A Man Arrested in Montreal For Crime. Montreal, Oct. 12.—George Tremblay, bricklayer, twenty years of age, who is wanted in Springfield, Mass., for breaking and entering into buildings.

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Desperate Sorties Made. St. Petersburg, Oct. 12.—In a despatch to the emperor, Gen. Stoessel confirms the report that desperate sorties from P. Arthur were made on October 6th and 6th, and states that the Russians, with greatly inferior forces, repulsed the Japanese four times, and captured ten Hotchkiss guns.

Gunboat Heiyen Lost. Tokio, Oct. 12.—The loss of the armored gunboat Heiyen is officially announced. The Heiyen struck a mine off Pigeon Bay, on the night of September 18th and foundered.

Retvisan's Attempt. Tokio, Oct. 12.—It is reported that the Russian battleship Retvisan steamed from under the cover of the battery at the mouth of the harbor at Port Arthur, last Sunday, but quickly returned to the shelter of the land guns.

American Girl Weds Abroad. Geneva, Switzerland, Oct. 12.—The American colony here, turned out in two columns for the wedding of Miss Kathryn Van Syckel, daughter of Mrs. Grace C. Van Syckel, of New York, and Lucien Brunel, of the Chateau d'Anney.

San Francisco, Cal., Oct. 12.—A wedding of interest in naval circles took place at Berkeley to-day, when Miss Anna Maxwell Miller, daughter of Rear-Admiral and Mrs. Merrill Miller, became the bride of Paymaster George Brown, Jr., U.S.N., son of Rear-Admiral George Brown, retired.
