BY FORMER EMPLOYEE OF MR. HARTY.

The Member For Kingston Years Ago Made Him a Loan—J. G. Liddell, of Brantford, Recalls the Incident.

Brantford, Ont., Oct. 17.—(To the Editor): Having noticed that Hon. William Hartly has agreed to become a candidate for the House of Commons, and that the occasion has been seized upon by some of those unscrupulous persons who are so unkindly friendly to his candidature to express sentiments with regard to his personal character, more particularly in regard to his dealings with his employees in the Canadian Locomotive works, it seems to me that the present time is not unfitting for the publication of my own personal experience in relation to an employee of Mr. Hartly in this regard.

In the year 1880, circumstances compelled me to leave my home in Kingston, with my family to seek my fortune in the western states. 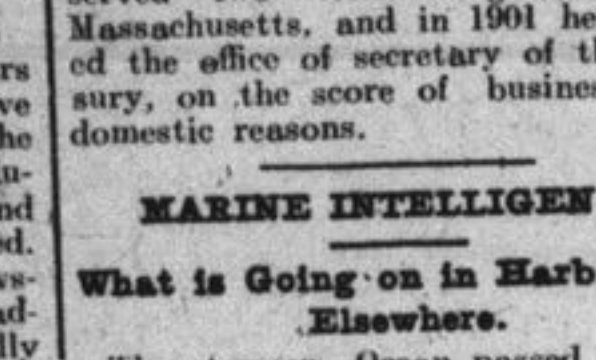
Miss Edith Bramhall, Sherbrooke, who has been visiting her brother for the past two months returned home to-day.
