One sees it in the smartest of shirt-waist suits for morning wear, with the skirt that clears the ground; and just shows the tip of the tiny black leather shoe. AS DAY LABORER

KAISER'S FRIEND HAD A HARD TIME OF IT.

Imperial Councilor Kolb, of Germany, in Disguise, Labored In Chicago—Writes a Book on Experience.

Chicago, Oct. 21.—From Berlin comes the story of a high official of the German government who came to this city some time ago and gained experience as a day laborer that he might study American conditions at first hand, and report to Emperor William whose close personal friendship he enjoys.

This official is no less a personage than Imperial Councilor Kolb, one of the most fastidious gentlemen of the imperial ministerial circle. Incidentally his adventure in this city furnished him with ample material for a book. Copies of this book have reached this country.

Herr Kolb in his story says: "Arrived in China and so completely disguised that I lost the appearance of a society-striken immigrant just from Germany, I applied for help and advice to a German society, where I was recommended to a humble inn in the centre of the city. The proprietor received me and showed me his choice of rooms. There were twelve of them, but only two had windows."

"Both of these windows with windows were almost occupied, so I had to be content with one of the black holes for which I had to pay \$1.25 weekly.
